Back Packing and Plein Air Painting through Europe

Patrick Okrasinski is a Scholarship Member who began his studies in the art world being accepted by the United States branch of The Florence Academy located in Jersey City NJ, He studied with such prominent Salmagundi members as Jordan Sokol and Edmond Rochat. After his third year of studies, Patrick was an artist in residence with the Claude Monet Foundation in Giverny, painting in Monet's garden and the surrounding countryside for a summer.

Although Patrick was awarded the prestigious Donald Jurney Traveling Fellowship Grant to travel and paint the great historical and cultural centers of Europe, his plans were curtailed by the pandemic. He continued to paint nearby scenes in our own Northeast of America.

Last year in 2021 Patrick was awarded the Hudson River Fellowship at Wethersfield. Also, with travel restrictions being eased, Patrick was able to finally travel and paint freely throughout Europe through the Donald Jurney Fellowship.

Kathy would like to take you on a short journey through her career, talking about her influences, risk taking, and growth as an artist using a combination of powerpoint and paintings. Kathy Anderson is best known for her unique interpretation of flowers and gardens, and intimate scenes of land-scape. Working in oils and painting mostly from life, her focus is on a strong design and movement in the painting, keeping the subject as naturally as you would find it. Her style is representational, but goes a step further into reality, often depicting weeds in the garden, flowers past their prime, etc.

Kathy is included in many prestigious private collections, is a master signature member of Oil Painters of America, an artist member of the Salmagundi Club NY, and is in the permanent collection of the National Arts Club, NYC. She teaches workshops in the US and abroad and has three popular videos.

She was lucky to be able to call as personal friends two of our greatest contemporary artists— Richard Schmid and Everett Raymond Kinstler, both sadly deceased. She has spent countless years with each of them, soaking up their wisdom and life stories.

"I see paintings everywhere- every flower, rock, tree, dapple of light, sparkling waterfall -there's no end to subject matter for an artist when your eyes are always open."

ith the strong movement to paint out of doors or En Plein Air, Roger Rossi, of the New York Salmagundi Club started a group in NYC and invited Salmagundians and their friends to paint out of doors. Meeting Roger at a Plein Air Convention we became friends and colleagues. He told me about the group he'd started in NYC and invited me to consider starting a branch in Southern California. Since I have been painting Plein Air and enjoy painting with other like-minded painters and thinking about the joy artists have, in simply going out to paint without any pressures of shows or competitions, it didn't take me long to decide and our Southern California group was born. That was nearly seven years ago, and we started small, but continue to be a popular venue and growing.

Living in Southern California we are blessed with a wonderful climate, just made for artists to paint out of doors, all year long. With that in mind, we really don't have a time we can't go out to paint. Therefore, we meet nearly every month at a designated location. Often one of our group will suggest a wonderful place, something, perhaps new to others, from other parts of Southern California.

Our group is spread throughout San Diego County, and further. Therefore I try and vary our painting locations, to include everyone, perhaps coming to different paint outs, depending where they live. We usually have at least ten painters in attendance, and we have had upwards of thirty at special events, such as painting at the Wieghorst Museum cactus gardens, complete with a mounted policeman model for us.

Our group has become known, and we are expanding. Recently, we were invited to paint in the Japanese Friendship Gardens, during cherry blossom time in March and had to limit our group to about 20 artists, not to overcrowd the pathways. It was very popular, both with visitors and our painters. Folks visiting seemed to







enjoy watching the artists painting, as much as seeing the cherry blossoms. The gardens also provided and area to show our paintings which visitors enjoyed. More and more people are becoming aware of our Salmagundi Club of New York, since we're out there painting and when people ask, are we part of a group, you can believe, we're proud to say we are. It's a joy spreading the word since many in So Cal hadn't heard about our wonderful club as yet.

Classical Figure Drawing II

This 9 week drawing course will teach classical principles for drawing the human form. You will study various approaches that build skills in accurate and aesthetic figure drawing. This course will deepen your understanding of modeling form, the effects of light, and human structure, learning from a figurative master.

This class will work in graphite, white and toned papers, and white pencil. To build your anatomical understanding, I will teach structures of the head, neck and shoulders, and naturalistic hair forms. The course will also focus on expressing mood and gesture through the pose and graphic choices. Build skills in hatching, cross hatching, line quality, contour and mark making. The curriculum includes full figure poses, and some details of the face.

Our First Vice President, Patricia Watwood, is offering a 9 week course in figure drawing with classes that begin on April 25th. to June 27th, 2022.

Patricia has for the last five months held highly successful evening sessions in our Rockwell Gallery called "Drink and Draw" with continual attendance of about 25 to 30 attendees both members and non-members. The sessions were open to all levels of artists who gathered together and drew from a nude model.

Italian Marble Carving Techniques for Sculpture

Fred Brownstein will deliver a lecture and live demonstration to show the traditional Italian techniques used to create marble sculpture.

Fred resides in Shaftsbury, VT, working in bronze and marble to make his sculpture. He lived and worked in Italy for sixteen years. During that time he studied figure drawing for four years with Maestra Nerina Simi in Florence and worked as an apprentice for four years at the Enzo Pasquini sculpture studio in Querceta. Fred learned the Italian marble carving techniques from Master marble sculptors Sirio DeRanieri, scultore and Vincenzo Donati, smodellatore.

Fred opened his own sculpture studio in Querceto in 1980. In 1985, he received his first public commission for the "Monumento ai Caduti" from the town of Stazzema in memory of the men who died in the two World Wars. Fred has since completed a dozen public sculptures as well as various private commissions.

Fred is a fellow member of the National Sculpture Society and a professional member of the Stone Carvers Guild.
